THIS WEEK'S PRAYER FOCUS IS TO LOVE ONE ANOTHER.

As we approach Valentines Day... LOVE is in the spotlight. As we continue our theme of Love One Another, Romans 12:10-13 is an appropriate verse to reflect on. If you have time, reading this passage in multiple translations can help deepen your understanding, as each version uses slightly different wording.

Romans 12:10-13 NIV (Holman, NET, NASB).

Be devoted to one another in brotherly love (mutual).

Honor one another above yourselves (outdo one another).

*Never be lacking in zeal (diligence),
but keep your spiritual fervor (enthusiasm),
serving the Lord. Be joyful in hope (rejoice),
patient in affliction (endure/persevere),
faithful in prayer (persistent/constant).*

Share with God's people who are in need (the saints).

Practice hospitality (pursue/show).



Throughout history, sacrificial love has been a defining mark of Christians. Jesus Himself identified it as the second greatest commandment. Early Christian leaders such as Tertullian and Dionysius highlighted this in their writings, describing the selfless, hospitable care believers showed—care that saved countless lives during times of plague. Even Emperor Julian reportedly urged his people to “compete with the Christian charities” after observing the powerful impact of Christians loving and caring for one another. In light of that example, what are some ways we can demonstrate love today—beyond simply giving flowers and candy?
