# SPRING SEMESTER HS FINAL EXAM SCHEDULE MAY 19-20, 2025

#### <u>Monday, May 19 Exam Schedule:</u>

8:00AM - 9:35AM 1<sup>st</sup> Block Exam 9:55AM - 11:30AM 2<sup>nd</sup> Block Exam \*HS dismissed at 11:30AM

#### Tuesday, May 20 Exam Schedule:

8:00AM - 9:35AM 3<sup>rd</sup> Block Exam 9:55AM - 11:30AM 4<sup>th</sup> Block Exam \*ALL students dismissed at 11:30AM

- Bible and elective classes will not give final exams. Courses such as PE, Art, Theater, Photography, and Yearbook will not have exams.
- Seniors who maintain a semester average of 90 or above are exempt from exams in Core Classes (English, Math, Science, and Social Studies).
- Students who do not have an exam in the first exam period of the day may come in late. STUDENTS COMING IN LATE MUST REPORT TO THE MAIN OFFICE TO SIGN IN.
- Students that do not have an exam in the last exam period of the day may leave after the first exam period. STUDENTS LEAVING EARLY MUST REPORT TO THE MAIN OFFICE TO SIGN OUT.
- NO HOT LUNCHES will be served for upper school on May 19th and 20th.
- The dress code for exams is relaxed for HS students. Students may wear loose fitting sweatpants for exams. Leggings, yoga pants, pajamas, short shorts, and sweatpants with writing across the rear are NOT allowed.
